Beloved in Christ:

I greet you all as fellow pilgrims with a heartfelt prayer that our Trinitarian God will bless you with a New Year replete with His abundant grace.


Just a few weeks ago I was blessed to lead a spiritual pilgrimage of 35 faithful disciples to the Holy Land: Actually, I was the spiritual leader on paper, but in all truthfulness the leaders who really made this an amazing pilgrimage were the tour organizers as well as the brilliant tour guides, bus drivers, bishops, priests, deacons and monastics with whom we were blessed to encounter on each day of our itinerary.

This spiritual journey had so many highlights – too many to mention in this month’s letter – but given the approaching *Feast of Theophany on January 6*, my mind is drawn to the place of our Lord’s Baptism by St. John, the Forerunner and holy patron of our beloved parish. Traveling south of the fertile and beautiful landscape of the Sea of Galilee – from which the Jordan River flows – the topography soon changed into a brown and arid wilderness that bordered the winding river. Our comfortable coach continued southbound, making a couple stops, first at the base of the Mount of Temptation (where our Lord underwent the temptations of Satan, and where our pilgrims were also tempted to buy fresh dates and Bedouin wares at the “Mall of Temptation”), and then at the Church of St. Elisha in the ancient 10,000 year-old city of Jericho (where we also saw the iconic sycamore tree that Zaccheus climbed to see the Lord).

Eventually we reached the day’s highlight, the professed site of our Lord’s Baptism, which had been off limits to pilgrims until the mid 1990s due to territorial wars – although the barbed wires and land mine warning signs still abound along the border between Israel and Jordan. The parking lot was full of tour busses and, yes, flies – yet that did not impede our mission to reach the river bank: I put on my epitrahilion (priestly stole), grabbed my new blessing cross which I purchased at the monastery in Capernaum for this event, and led our group down the path while chanting the festal hymn of Theophany. Swatting flies all the way down, we finally arrived . . . to murky waters! I blessed each pilgrim with the waters from the Jordan River, while also cautioning them to *not drink* the water they collected in their bottles, even as we witnessed large groups of people donned in white robes descending into the river to be baptized. On the way back to our coach, through the swarm of flies I observed a flock of white doves – and this was the only site where I witnessed such during our entire pilgrimage – which was somewhat of an epiphany that something extraordinary must have happened here.

Admittedly, this was one of the rare times during our awesome and overall life-changing pilgrimage when I was somewhat disappointed: I had anticipated taking some of the actual water home from the Jordan for blessing on Holy Theophany and each Baptism, but the raw waste floating in my vial deterred me from doing so. With further reflection, I have since deduced that these polluted waters, just like the defilement of our fallen human nature, point to the very reason why our Lord Jesus Christ came in the flesh, was Baptized, voluntarily Crucified and Resurrected from the dead: Specifically, to purify and liberate us from the murkiness of our sins, to show mercy and forgive us, and especially to raise us up from death itself.

Report**


Greetings to all from the Parish Council as we enter the New Year!

They will be joining the returning members, Gus Flangas, John Matsis, Adam Bieker, Bessie Stavropoulos, Stacy Mavrantonis and John Nicholas. All Parish Council Members will be taking the Oath of Office on *Sunday, January 6* during the Divine Liturgy, and election of officers will follow the service.

January as always will be eventful in our Church, with the Great Blessing of the Water and our annual St. John the Baptist Name Day Luncheon taking place on the *Sunday of Theophany (January 6)*, and the annual Blessing and Cutting of the Vasilopita on *Sunday, January 13*. 

Stewardship and Community Outreach

Following hot on the heels of a joyous Nativity season and the afterglow of Theophany, perhaps we can pray a special prayer for St. John the Baptist Greek Orthodox Church here in Las Vegas, Nevada during the Great Blessing of the Waters. Maybe those same blessed waters may be used for a cold splash in the face for stewards and non-stewards alike, reinforcing the message of the past year . . . softening us who are hard-hearted, ringing out to us who have ears but do not hear, and enlightening us who have eyes, but do not see.

Our Stewardship Committee, our Parish Council, and our Priests have spent much of the past year reminding, exhorting, cajoling, and pleading with parishioners regarding the state of our community's stewardship versus the ongoing struggles to meet basic Church operating expenses and addressing much needed facility maintenance, repairs, and security upgrades. Of course, the stewardship message is oft repeated but there has been a special focus this year to highlight our funding struggles and we have spent the past year pounding the stewardship drum. Every. Single. Month.



Well, a year has come and gone with little real progress. A few major contributors were lost, and a few were gained but on the whole, very little headway was made regarding getting more people to participate at what the Archdiocese would deem minimal, let alone acceptable, levels based on current parish regulations.

In a healthy Church, paid stewardship should cover all basic operating expenses. Ideally, it should generate even more funds, in order to entertain growth opportunities regarding facilities, ministries, staff, etc. However, reviewing the numbers Gus recently shared in Church clearly indicates stewardship levels are leaving our Church finances far from healthy. Using the final 2017 basic operating expenses of \$992,084 and stewardship of \$380,826 we can divide and translate that to a calendar to see that last year, our stewardship would have only kept the Church running from January 1 through May 20. Using the latest (November) 2018 stewardship numbers compared to last year's basic operating expenses indicates we are doing a smidgeon better: Our stewardship would have kept the Church running from January 1 through May 27. Both are a far cry (in the wilderness) from December 31!

In his epistle, St. James asks, *“What does it profit . . . if someone says he has faith but does not have works?”* and then answers shortly thereafter, *“. . . faith by itself, if it does not have works, is dead.” (James 2:14, 17)* In the Revelation to St. John, our Lord Jesus Christ Himself (referenced here as *“the Amen, the Faithful and True Witness, the Beginning of the creation of God”*) warns the Church at Laodicea (and us today) that our faith ought not to be lukewarm. *“I know your works, that you are neither cold nor hot. I could wish you were cold or hot. So then, because you are lukewarm, and neither cold nor hot, I will vomit you out of My mouth.” (Revelation 3:15-16)* The accompanying study notes which follow these harsh words, explain that “The Laodiceans were lukewarm in spiritual fervor and good works; their lack of commitment is revolting to the Lord, who would have them go one way or the other.” (*Orthodox Study Bible*)

Friends, let us all make a commitment in 2019 to turn back to the Lord, increasing in both spiritual fervor and good works such that it will be evident that our faith (and community) is neither dead nor dying. The time to live our faith is now. The time to enact our good intentions is now. The time to demonstrate that St. John the Baptist Greek Orthodox Church in Las Vegas, Nevada is capable of being a strong, vibrant, and growing community is now. Let us remove the tarnish our hard hearts have become encompassed by and become the “Jewel in the Desert” God is calling us to be.

From Father Seraphim

There is a striking absence of 30 year-olds in our Church. The latest research reports that a staggering 60 percent of teens will leave our Church in their adolescence and by their 20s will no longer identify as Orthodox Christians. I have met many of our young people who fit into this age category and no longer attend Church services or actively practice their Faith. Some I met at the Greek Food Festival, others at Monday Night Basketball or a Young Adults ministry event like ice-skating or a dinner gathering. Speaking in an atmosphere of openness and love, never condemning – but seeking to truly understand them I have been able to ask, “Why don’t you come to Church on Sunday morning?” The answers vary. Some sense being judged by an older generation for piercings or how they dress, some experience comments when they do go about their infrequent attendance, and some even admit plain laziness. Faith or belief in God is not necessarily absent, but they do have serious questions: “How does faith square with science and evolution? What about the homosexual and transgender community? Why is sex before marriage wrong? Aren’t there errors in the Bible? Is smoking marijuana or getting drunk really a sin? The people in Church are hypocrites, one way in Church and then outside they just gossip or criticize so why go there?”

Subconsciously acknowledging the growing absence of this demographic from our Church, we know that we have a serious problem and need to fix it: So we bring on a youth director/pastoral assistant or ask the Bishop to send us a second Priest. The main job description is, “The Youth,” while this person is surely learning the ins and outs of parish ministry as well. Without trying to shirk any responsibility, and entirely dedicated to connecting our children, teens, and young adults to the living Christ, I must say this is an inadequate solution. The problem is simple mathematics: I get to spend a few hours a month with the youth in our parish. On the other hand, kids spend 8-16 hours a day in schools, on the internet/inhabiting social media websites, around friends, and in a culture/society, that is very secular and increasingly hostile to traditional Christian morality, practice and belief.

A different solution is for every mother and father to know that their primary responsibility concerning their children is not to make sure their child makes it into a prestigious college and goes on to perform well in a lucrative career. We parents must ensure that from their earliest days, our children are placed on a path and way of life we ourselves have embraced. We can forget that Christianity is not just a belief system we subscribe to or a box we check to make sure we go to heaven. Orthodoxy is fundamentally a way of life, practicing actions of love and virtue that form a character and transformed personality: We actually become holy like Christ. Just coming to Church on Sundays or having been baptized into the true Faith cannot be something we tack on to a secular way of life. If parents have not taken the time to know why they are Orthodox Christians and how to live as Orthodox Christians, we can be sure the children will not easily find the path to salvation simply by going to monthly ministry events at Church.

The percentage of 20 and 30 year-olds leaving our Church drops dramatically to just 10 percent and lower in families where both parents actively practice Christianity (praying with their children, fasting as a family, attending the Divine Liturgy together weekly and on weekdays and major feasts, reading the lives of the saints and the Gospel, and speaking openly and frequently about difficult moral issues facing their kids every day, such as abortion, pornography, drugs, etc.). We can still have a youth pastor and parent volunteers running ministries to increase and build upon our family’s already existing identity as Orthodox Christians: But this should not substitute for our own example as the primary teachers for our kids about how important God, the Church, Faith, prayer, confession, and reading the Scriptures is. If we neither pray, nor fast, go to Church infrequently nor read spiritual books – how could we expect our children to become serious, faithful Orthodox Christians?
